Cast and Creative team/ Berlin -as at 08/2002-

Directing/concept

After a career as a craftsman, Dirk Cieslak studied Social Sciences and Philosophy at the University of Bremen and the London School of Economics. Since 1989 Dirk has been artistic director of the actor's collective, Lubricat, for which he has also written many pieces for performance. He has also directed for the international culture factory, Kampnagel; and 1993 onwards for theatres in Berlin including Volksbühne Ost, Theater am Halleschen Ufer and Kunsthaus Tacheles. In 1996 Dirk became a co founder of the Sophiensaele, and since then has been an 'artist in residence' there.

Dramaturgy/concept

Zebu Kluth studied German, Theatre and Media Studies at the Freie Universität, Berlin. From 1991 to 1996 he worked as a press and publicity officer for the Hebbel Theatre, Berlin. In 1996 he helped found the Sophiensaele, and in the same year became the artist director of the theatre am Halleschen Ufer, Berlin. In 2001 Zebu left this position to work as a freelance dramaturg and concept-creator/copywriter for the Agency for Communications Design TPA.

Assistance

Zoe Svendsen was born in Cardiff, Wales. After studying English at the University of Cambridge, Zoe moved to Berlin in 2000, to train and work as a translator and director. Her directing credits include Shakespeare's The Winter's Tale (European Tour), an adaptation of Company of Wolves by Angela Carter for the stage and Kassandra, a devised performance piece (Edinburgh Festival 1999). Other translations include Sound Bite by Dirk Cieslak and Killer Fish by Manfred Karge. She is the co-founder of Context Theatre.

Theaterhaus. She has had exhibitions of her work in Germany and Austria.

Performer Miriam Fiordeponti, born 1961, trained in acting at the Acting Academy, Zürich, freelance theatre work includes: Kampnagelfabrik Hamburg (Babylon, Barbara Neureiter, Gabriella Bussacker), Sophiensaele Berlin (Lubricat/Dirk Cieslak), Theatre 'an der Winkelweise' Zürich (Andre Becker). Basel Theatre (Barbara Bilabel, Christoph Nel), Hamburg Schauspielhaus (Carolyn Carlson), Hamburg Kammerspiele (Ulrich Waller). Further work in Film and TV.

Performer Barbara Spitz was born and grew up in London. As well as being a professionally trained teacher, Barbara is a performer and rock musician with her own band. She has worked as an actress at many theatres in Vienna and Berlin, including at the Vienna Schauspielhaus and with Lubricat.

Performer Niels Borman was born in 1973 in Bremen. Since completing his training in acting at the University for Arts, Berlin, in 2000, Niels has worked as a freelance actor on various projects, including with Lubricat, Aktionstheatre, at the Deutsches Theater for Einar Schleef, and at the Hamburg Schauspielhaus.

Performer Martin Clausen was born in 1973 in Laubach. In 2001 he completed his training at the School for F.M. Alexander Technique in Berlin. An autodidact, Martin has, over the years, taken part in diverse independent theatre and dance productions, including working with Nico and the Navigators, the choreographer Sommer Ulrickson and Angela Schubot, and Lubricat. In 2001 he presented his forth self-devised short work at the Theatre Festival, "Neuropolis".

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 The acting collective, *Lubricat*, has, since being founded in 1989, worked continuously with a changing company drawn from a pool of theatre artists. Moving beyond the fashions, theories and conventions of traditional language-based theatre, Lubricat has persevered in devising and developing its own version of contemporary theatre practice. Lubricat has gained a strong reputation with critics and audiences alike for the projects it creates.

Sophiensæle

The Sophiensaele - Berlin venue and co-producer
The Sophiensaele was founded in Autumn 1996. Since
then, the Sophiensaele has established itself not only
as the most widely known independent theatre in Berlin,
but also as an important co-producer of cross regional
and international dance and theatre productions. The
house presents the work of young artists who want
to develop an individual language of theatre beyond
that of the large theatre institutions. Its programme
consists largely in premieres of dance, music and
theatre, at the cutting edge of theatre tradition.

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
